## Venus ISD Receives Energy Effciency Grant

Through United Cooperative Services' EnergySmarts Grant Program, the electric co-op is providing much-needed grant funding to eligible schools and independent school districts served by the electric cooperative for the installation and implementation of energy efficiency measures. United Board Di-

rector Clifford Deal last month presented a grant to Venus ISD Superintendent Bobby Matthews in the amount of \$5,000, helping the school district work toward its energy efficiency objectives.

"We think it's wonderful that United has made these funds available for our energy conservation efforts," said Matthews. "We have a tremendous amount of renovation going on and every little bit helps," he said.

The Texas Legislature in 2007 mandated (H.B. 3693) that Texas schools reduce energy consumption by 5 percent each year for the next six years. Venus ISD will apply the \$5,000 grant to several areas, including installation of motion sensor light switches, solar screens and insulation.

"The cooperative's EnergySmarts grants demonstrate United Cooperative Services' commitment to helping members manage their energy use," said Deal. "Not only does United educate its members about energy conservation; we help them achieve it," said Deal.

In addition to the energy conservation mandate, the Legislature also gave co-ops the opportunity to invest unclaimed capital credits (also referred to as "member dividends") in their members' energy efficiency efforts and scholarship awards. These unclaimed dividends—distributed annually to members of the co-op—would otherwise go to the state. The EnergySmarts grants are funded 100 percent by the unclaimed member dividends. To date, United has distributed \$46,500 in EnergySmarts grants to local schools and ISDs.

"With Texas H.B. 3693 requiring schools to set energy conservation and reduction goals, our EnergySmarts Grant program is a useful response to help schools meet that mandate," said United CEO Ray Beavers.

On Sept. 29, 2008, United Cooperative Services (co-op) adopted a resolution initiating a rulemaking project to consider and determine whether to implement federal ratemaking standards under the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 (PURPA), as amended by the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007 (EISA), Public Law No. 110-140, I2| Stat. 1492 (2007) to: i) integrate energy efficiency into the co-op's integrated resource plans and establish costeffective energy efficiency as a priority resource; 2) establish electric rates to align utility incentives with the delivery of cost effective energy efficiency and to promote energy efficiency investments; and 3) give co-op members direct written or electronic access and other interested persons limited access to information on time-based electricity prices at wholesale and retail, prices and usage on at least a daily basis, and sources of power provided by the co-op. The proceeding has been designated Project No. 2008-TX164-0001, Proceeding to Consider and Determine Whether to Implement the Federal Standards for Integrated Resource Planning, Rate Design Modifications to Promote Energy Efficiency Investments, and Access to Smart Grid Information pursuant to 16:U.S.C. § 2621(d) (16), (17) and (17) as amended by Pub. L. No. 110-140, 121 Stat. 1492 (2007). Persons interested in the proceeding are invited to notify the co-op of their intent to participate in the project and to submit comments, data, views, arguments, and other evidence on the standards being considered.
